

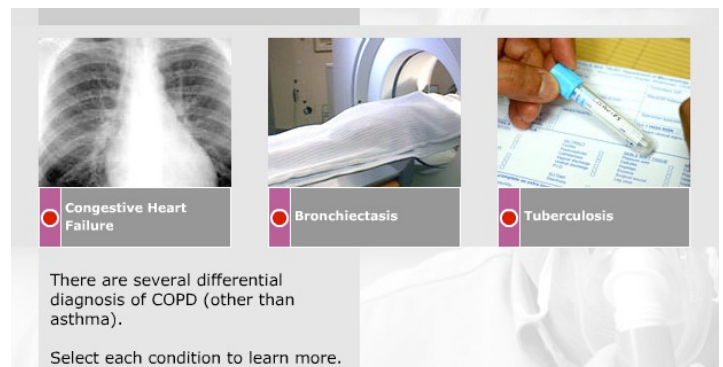
Managing Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

A report, called "Breathing Fear", suggested that only one in four people with a potentially fatal condition have it diagnosed. The condition is chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and it is predicted that it will be the third largest killer by the year 2020 (British Thoracic Society).
